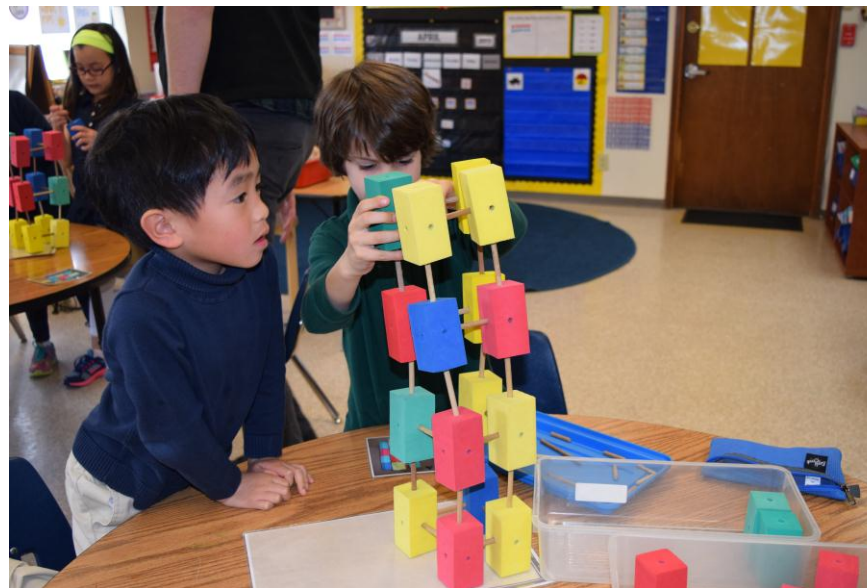

## This Week: March 30<sup>th</sup> – April 3<sup>rd</sup>

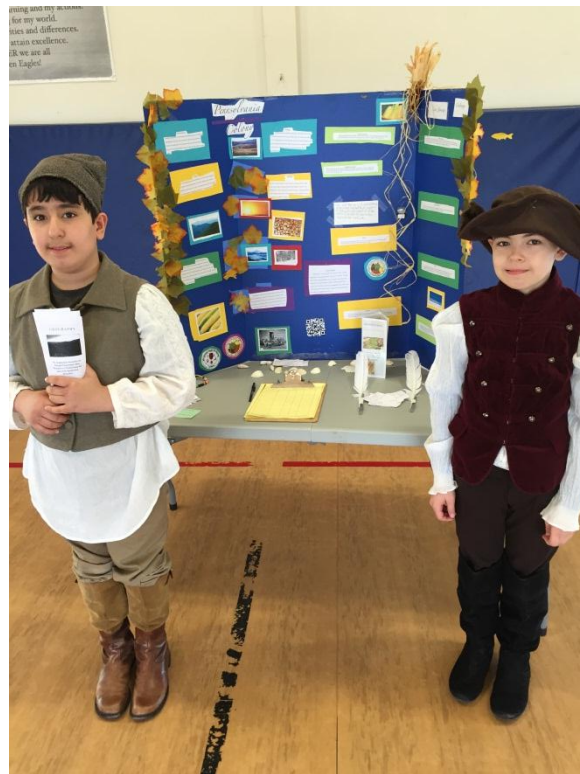

#### Sail America Expo



In order to learn about life in colonial America in the 1600s, our 5<sup>th</sup> graders participated in SAIL AMERICA which had students work in pairs to create travel brochures for each of the original 13 colonies. Students sharpened their research and organizational skills as they gathered information about the colony's geography, climate, natural resources, economy, leaders, government, and Native American residents. After they completed their brochures, the whole class took part in a "travel expo" where students staff and decorate booths, create travel documents, prepare sales pitches, and book clients for passage to the New World.
