# Evergreen Academy Ethnobotanical Garden



Our fourth graders have established an Ethnobotanical Garden on Evergreen's campus. Ethnobotany is the study of plant lore. Many indigenous people used and still use various native plants for medicine, dye, food, raw materials for canoes, clothing, houses, tools and ceremonial artwork. The Evergreen Academy Ethnobotanical Garden displays native plant species the students have identified and researched. They include the following: Salal, Red Elderberry, Red Twig Dogwood, Oregon Grape, Irish Moss, Scotch Moss, Wild Mock Orange, Sword Fern, Common Snowberry, Evergreen Huckleberry, Wild Ginger, Bunchberry, Creeping Mahonia and Bearberry. Our fourth graders' work in our Ethnobotanical Garden ties in with their Washington State history and Native American studies curriculum.

Third Graders Study the Lifestyle, Customs and Arts of Plains and Southwest Native Americans

For the past few weeks the third grade class has been studying the lifestyle, customs, and arts of the Plains and Southwest Native Americans. One of the essential questions for this unit is: How do stories, legends, and the arts serve as expressions of cultural traditions? To answer this, students have discussed the significance of different forms of Native art, such as buffalo hide paintings and Navajo loom weaving.

We will continue this unit by studying the Eastern Woodland tribes and the Southeast tribes. This is the perfect set up for the fourth grade curriculum on Northwest tribes. The students are having a great time learning about different cultures!
